# Maths

Go on a mini beast hunt around your garden using a pictograph to record your findings. Using your findings, can you count how many of each creature you found? Which creature did you find the most/least of? How do you know?

Use your play dough to make lots of different width and length worms. Can your order them by size and length from the longest to the shortest and widest to narrowest? You could also weigh them to find the lightest and heaviest. You could add labels to show which is which.

Can you record your findings with photographs or by getting your grown ups to write down what you discover and say about the activity ?

## Design & Make



Design and make your own mini beast garden. This could be from things from your garden or from recycled item from inside. How many different mini beasts can you add to your garden?



Don't forget to design and plan it first. You could even make notes on your plan as you're working then write a sentence about it when you have finished.

Please take photos and record what you say about your garden for us.



# Physical Development

Cut some strips of paper and make a paper chain caterpillar, use your fine motor skills to roll and attach the paper circles to each other. How long can you make your caterpillar? If you have beads at home, you could thread a caterpillar at home too, then some eyes and antenna to him.

Draw around your hands, but not your thumbs, cut

them out -stick them together and add features to make your own spider. Try to do your own cutting. Practise moving like mini beastsquirm like a worm, scuttle like a



beetle, scurry like an ant - what other creatures could you be?

### Literacy & Phonics

Write some clues for somebody in your family to quess what mini beast you are thinking of, but don't tell them what it is.

Draw some of the mini-beasts you know of or have found, can you label them and add a caption or sentence for each one?

. Use lots of lovely describing words and listen carefully for all the sounds you know in the words you are writing.
