This week, we are going to write a piece in the third person about this unusual setting and the man within it. Remember to include a range of sentence types (eg. 2 pair, emotion word, short sentences, outside (inside), if if then) Use the 'sentence challenge' and 'sick sentences!' to support your writing! 1) Character - What can we infer about the man in the image? Questions to consider - How is he feeling? How old is he? Does he live a comfortable life? Where is he living? Consider the evidence in the picture to support this. 2) Character - How has the man in the image ended up living there? Do you think he enjoys it? What has happened in his past? 3) Setting - Senses.
