Create a teddy bears picnic - how many plates, cups, cutlery will you need for your bears? What food will you serve them? I like cheese and crisp sandwiches and grapes on my picnics.



Make yourself some binoculars out of toilet rolls and go for a bear hunt with you family (parents - maybe you could hide some bears for them).



Draw, paint or create a bear - will it a brown bear, a polar bear or even an American black bear?

Can you make your own small world bear hunt? Get a box, a bear, some lego, duplo or playmobile people and start creating.



Make a sensory bear trail. With your parents help, make a bear hunt trail - get a tray of water, grass, cotton wool (snow), twigs, and mud. Close your eyes and put your bare feet in each tray - can you guess which one it is? Which one was your favourite? What did each one feel like?
