Draw some different size dino footprints and use 2p coins, Lego bricks or something estimate then measure how long/wide they are. Can you order them by size?

Design & Make

Create a dinosaur habitat using things you have at home or in the garden. What do you think dinosaurs would like in their habitat ?A shoe box or cereal box

would be a super start. You could make a plan and design it first then add labels and notes as you work.



If you have any old tissue boxes, you could also make your on set of dinosaur stomping feet. dinosaur or draw a dinosaur and label the different parts.

You could also make up your very own story about a new dinosaur from your imagination. We'd love to see what wonderful ideas you can come up with.

Remember to use your phonic knowledge as you



write. Listening carefully for all the sounds in the words you are trying to write. Which tricky words can you remember and recognise?
