Monday – consider what tense you will write this in. Will it be past, present or future? Can you use the perfect form of verbs?


Tuesday – use adverbials of time/place and manner to link your ideas and, in paragraphs. For example, firstly, secondly, in addition.

Wednesday – can you incorporate subordinate clauses and vary the position in the sentence. For example: 'Despite being in lockdown, I still remain hopeful that I can see my friends again soon'.

Thursday – can you add in some Alan Peat sentences? For example, if, if, if?
