### Physical Development

How many different jungle animals can you move like? Use all your body parts to move in a variety of ways.

Ask your grown ups to create an assault course for you to complete, moving over, under, through, jumping, running and hopping

Create a jungle snake by threading, buttons, pasta, cherrios or paper rolled beads on to string.

## Maths

Using a variety of 2D shapes cut of paper see if you can create a jungle animal. Can you name the shapes you gave used!? You could even label them. Talk about the features of the these shapes such as the sides, corners and the number of these on each shape.

Write the numbers 1-10/20 on pieces of paper then ask your grown ups to hide these around the house or garden for you. Go and find all the numbers - can you create a number line with the numbers in the right order. You could even add the corresponding amount of dots or objects to each number.

## Design & Make

Paint or draw around and colour in your hand, then cut it out and add features to make your own jungle giraffe. Which other animals can you create using your hand print?

Decorate a kitchen roll tube, add a top and a bottom, before sealing these add rice or pasta to create your own rain stick.

Using an information book or the internet to research a jungle animal or 2 and then write a simple sentence or 2 about each animal. Blow your grown—up's socks off by reading some parts of the information yourself. If you are feeling particularly ambitious, you could create your own 'jungle book'. Don't forget to add the titles, author and a blurb on the back.

Remember to use your phonic knowledge as you write. Listening carefully for all the sounds in the words you are trying to write Which tricky words can you remember and recognise? Pop your writing or a photograph of it in your scrapbook for us please.
