- ✓ 1 3/4 cup flour
- ✓ 2 1/4 tsp baking powder
- \checkmark 1/4 tsp salt
- ✓ 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- ✓ 1 tbsp unsalted butter
- ✓ 3/4 water (more as needed)
- ✓ Oil for frying
