Some superb diary entries came in last week about the battle between Jason and the skeletons. This week, your task is to write a non-chronological report about a 'trireme'.



Monday — Firstly, you will need to research the trireme and then think about a topic title, write a brief introductory paragraph and identify the subheadings to organise your work.

Tuesday – practise writing your first paragraph in a formal tone, present tense and third person to ensure informality.

Wednesday – continue to write your next paragraph, adding relative clauses and parenthesis to give extra information.

Thursday – organise your work into the relevant subheadings and use adverbials to link ideas across sentences.

Friday – write your non-chronological report.

Last week, we looked at the 1960s through the lens of the Space Race and Neil Armstrong walking on the moon in 1969.
