## Creative Writing

### Persuasion

Your task this week is to write a persuasive letter/ presentation/ speech- your choice! The question you will be answering is: Should Ariel be allowed to live on the land? You can choose whichever side you want to argue.

### Daily tasks:

- 1- Complete your planning sheet. Think about your arguments. Why would it be good/ bad for Ariel to live on land? What is the strongest argument? What persuasive devices from the word bank will you include? Research Alan Peat sentences and choose which ones you will include.
- 2- Use your planning frame to write the first draft of your introduction and strongest argument first. When you have finished, re-read your work. Can you underline any SPaG errors to correct?
- 3- Write your first drafts of arguments 2 and 3 and finish off with your conclusions. When you have finished, re-read it and highlight/ underline any words/ phrases you could uplevel.
- 4- Editing! Go back and complete the editing you have been highlighting at the end of each day. Use a different colour and use footnotes to help make any bigger changes. How many persuasive devices have you included?
- 5- Put it all together! Now that you've written and edited your drafts, it's time to write your perfectly persuasive piece applying all of your corrections.

## Science & DT

### Science: Materials and Properties

Materials have different properties and purposes. What would the best material be for Eric's ship? Look around your house for possible materials you could use to build a junk model of Eric's ship.

### Planning your ship

- List your equipment
- Play about with different possible ways you will put the materials together and what shape you will create
- Sketch your ship labelling the materials you will include and why.

### DT: Junk Modelling

Using the materials you have collected, build your ship for Eric to travel on. Remember: it has to be fit for a prince!

Finally, test it! You could use a paddling pool or bath tub. We're looking for:

- **Floatability** (a boat that doesn't float won't be much help!)
- **Durability** (Did you choose the appropriate materials or did your boat fall apart? Will it survive Eric's travels on the seven seas?)
- **Holdability** (Can it hold weight? Eric will have an entire crew, their belongings, food, water, weapons and lots of other cargo all stored on the ship so it must be able to hold weight!)

## Creative Curriculum

### Geography

Disney is well known for bringing traditional tales and stories from all around the world to life on the big screen! This week's task is a little different, we are going to find out where all of our favourite movies are from. I'll bet some of them will surprise you!

Task 1- Create a table with 3 columns. Like this:

Name of Disney movie...	Where I think it's set...	Where I know it's set..
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Make a list of as many Disney movies (not Pixar) that you can in 5 minutes. At the end of the 5 minutes, you can Google it and see if there are any you've missed.

Next, go back over your list. Can you remember where any of the stories were set? Think about any mentions of places in the stories/ songs etc. If you don't know for sure, estimate.

Then, research where each movie/ story is set and add them in to the third column of your table. See if you can be more specific and find cities/ towns. If you can't find a specific answer then you could use where the original author was from.

Task 2- Print out or draw a world map and label the cities/ towns where each Disney movie is set.

<p>Last week was Bike Week 2020 so this week's PE tasks are all around biking!</p> <p><b>Promote Bike Week 2020</b></p> <p>Create a poster aiming to get more people in to biking as a pastime/ sport/ form of exercise.</p> <p>You could talk about the benefits, famous bikers etc.</p> <p>Questions to think about:</p> <p>What type of exercise is biking?</p> <p>What muscle groups benefit from biking?</p> <p><b>Activities:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Go out for a long cycle alone or with your sibling/family. You could use a FitBit or phone to track how far you cycle.</li> </ul> <p><b>Bicycle-themed home workout</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Bicycle kicks 30 secs on, 30 second rest.</li> <li>- Bicycle crunches 30 secs on, 30 second rest</li> <li>- Bicycle arms 30 secs on, 30 second rest (hold light weights or cans of beans for extra challenge!)</li> <li>- Repeat circuit for 6 minutes (each exercise twice) for a killer ab and arm workout!</li> </ul>	<p>The Little Mermaid is a traditional tale. The tale was first published in 1837 and was written by Danish author, Hans Christian Anderson.</p> <p>Since then, many versions of the story have been shared all around the world. Your reading task this week is to read the alternate version we've uploaded and answer the attached comprehension questions. You'll find it's very different to the Disney version we know so well!</p> <p>You can type the answers or write them and send them to us in an e-mail. The resources have been uploaded.</p>	<p>Ariel lives under the sea in a place called Atlantica, your art task this week is to create your own underwater scene. You can use whichever medium you like but to experiment with something you don't normally use. You could also use mixed media (more than one).
