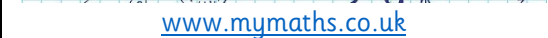

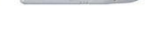

How can you recreate 4 of them at home using equipment or objects around the house?

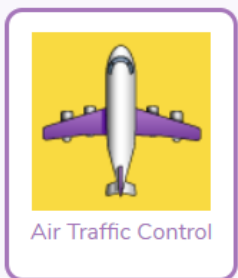
Why not make it a family event?
