Woodthorne Values

Courage - to say hello and Good morning or afternoon to all adults at Woodthorne.

Ambition- to start to write name with correct letters.

Respect - start to find solutions to conflict and rivalries.

Excellence - to keep on trying, even when things are difficult.



Communication & Language

To understand a question or instruction that has to parts, such as: "Get your coat and wait at the door".

To be able to tell a long story.

Personal Social and Emotional Development

To show more confidence in new situations.

To remember rules without needing an adult to remind them.

Take turns with others.

Physical Development

To use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors.

To use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.

Literacy

To name the different parts of a book.

To know that print has meaning.

To tell a simple story independently.

Maths

To discuss routes and locations, using words like 'in front of' and 'behind',

To compare quantities using language: 'more than', 'fewer than'.

Understanding the World

To talk about the differences between materials and changes they notice.

To join in with simple cooking and baking.

Expressive Arts and Design

To begin to develop complex stories using small world equipment like animal sets, dolls and dolls houses, etc.

To develop their own ideas and then decide which materials to use to express them.
